







M4C INITIATIVE

Climate change disproportionately affects a wide number of nations and communities around the world. The <u>Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF)</u> and its members have been at the forefront of the fight against climate change.

In a world grappling with the climate emergency, migration can be a story of hope, resilience, and opportunities when migrants, diasporas and their communities become **actors of climate action**.

Migrants4Climate (M4C): A New Decade to Act on Climate Change and Migration is the Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF) Initiative that enhances CVF's commitment to advance knowledge and action on migration in the context of climate change in countries most vulnerable to climate change.

- M4C recognizes that the climate emergency has significant impacts on human mobility across the world.
- M4C supports global commitments on migration and climate change, with a specific focus on vulnerable countries and communities experiencing the most devastating climate impacts.
- M4C promotes an inclusive and participatory process that leverages migrants' and diasporas' contributions to climate action and to sustainable development, at national and local levels.

OUR VISION

- M4C calls for **greater solidarity** with and support for migrant and displaced communities most impacted by the adverse effects of climate change.
- M4C emphasizes the devastating impacts of slow onset climate change processes and **promotes actions** that address their migration impacts.
- M4C considers migrants and diasporas as **dynamic actors of climate action** and gives visibility and supports their initiatives.
- M4C builds a **positive narrative about migration** to bolster migrants' and diasporas' and their communities' participation and contributions to climate action.

MAIN ACTIVITIES

M4C activities contribute to key policy processes on migration and climate change:

- implementation of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM)
- implementation of the Paris
 Agreement on Climate Change
 and the Conference of Parties
 (COP) under the United Nations
 Framework Convention on Climate
 Change (UNFCCC)
- the work of the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD)
- the work of the Human Rights Council (HRC)

M4C activities aim to integrate migration to various CVF¬V20 led activities such as:

- the Climate Prosperity Plans (CPPs)
- the Climate Vulnerability Monitor (CVM)
- the Global Parliamentary Group (GPG)
- the CVF and V20 Finance including Loss & Damage Finance
- Human rights and Climate agenda



THE AWARD

- The initiative is led by the Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF), as part of the Forum's commitment to advance action on migration in the context of climate change. The M4C Award is implemented in collaboration with the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD).
- The initiative aims to promote the role of migrants and diaspora communities in climate action.
- The Initiative sheds groundbreaking light on the multiple contributions that migrants already make to the fight against climate change and supports new climate focused activities.

The Migrants4Climate (M4C) Award focuses on initiatives led by - or with migrants' and diasporas' involvement - that contribute to climate action and that are inclusive, innovative, impactful, and inspirational. Over 110 nominations were received from 56 countries.

Through these initiatives, the Award aims to shape a new narrative on migration, where migrants, diaspora and their communities, play a positive role in the fight against climate change.


Projet Route De La Jacinthe D'Eau | Benin


